Stranger Danger



Have you ever **communicated** with
someone on the internet that you have
never met in real life?!



Stranger Danger



The internet allows you to **communicate** with people around the world.

This can be through **games, social media** and other **websites**.

People we meet on the internet **may not be nice!**



Stranger Danger



- You should **never arrange to meet** anyone in real life that you have met on the internet.
- If someone is pressuring you to meet, you must **tell a trusted adult**

Online Bullying



If you are **repeatedly** saying or doing something with the intention to **hurt someone** either **emotionally or physically**, this is **bullying**.

It does not matter if it is face to face or via the internet, it is still bullying!

If this happens via the internet, it is often known as “**Online Bullying**” or “**Cyber Bullying**”

Online Bullying

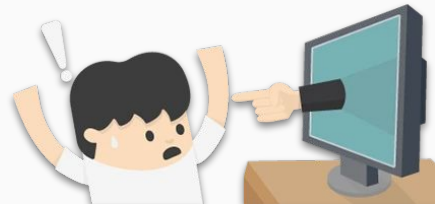


Online bullying can happen in many different ways, for example:

- Social Media (e.g. Instagram / Facebook)
- Messaging (e.g. Snapchat / Whatsapp)
- Online Games



If you are a victim, **block** the person, **save the evidence** and **report it!**
You must tell a trusted adult.

Private Information



- Information that you share on the internet could potentially be viewed by millions of people!
- **Never share personal information** on the internet, this could include your **full name**, **address** and **passwords**.

Passwords



Your online accounts are usually kept secure by using a **password**.

Top tips for passwords:

1. Never share your password with others
2. Try to avoid simple passwords, use letters and numbers
3. Try not to use the same password on every website
4. Do not write your passwords down where someone might find them

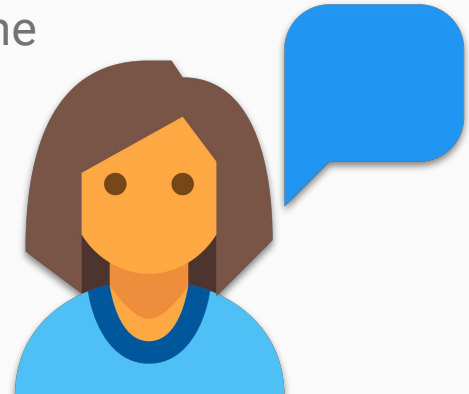

Tell and adult!



- If you have any concerns at all when using the internet, it is really important that you tell a trusted adult
- This includes any of the following:
 - You are not sure if you should share something online
 - A stranger is communicating with you online
 - You think somebody knows your password
 - Somebody is bullying you online
